## **Call to Order:**

Mayor Turner called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

## **Roll Call:**

Roll call was answered by Councilman Robert Blankenship, Councilman Brack Herald, Councilwoman Gearding, Councilman Robert Honaker, Councilwoman Jones and Councilman Tim Gilkison.

## **Approval of Minutes:**

**Upon motion of Councilwoman Jones seconded by Councilman Herald to approve the Minutes of May 2, 2016 Regular Meeting. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.**

**Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Honaker to Approve financial reports and authorize payment of bills for General Fund Ending 4/30/16. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.**

## **Attorney's Report:**

Attorney Verst was not present at the meeting.

Mayor Turner presented **Ordinance No. 16-0601: Adopting the City of Wilder, Kentucky's Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 7/1/16 through 6/30/17 by Estimating Revenues and Appropriating Funds for the Operation of City Government.**

**Upon motion of Councilman Herald seconded by Councilman Blankenship to approve Ordinance No. 16-0601: Adopting the City of Wilder, Kentucky's Annual Budget for Fiscal**

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**Year 7/1/16 through 6/30/17 by Estimating Revenues and Appropriating Funds for the Operation of City Government. Mayor Turner called for a vote. [First Reading]**

**Citizen Comments:**

**Mayor's Comments:**

- Summer Recreation Program started June 6th and runs through July 22nd and is a great program.
- City Wide Yard Sale is June 10th, 11th and 12th.
- Street repairs list is complete.
- Captain Neyman has brought down the new pumper for everyone to see.
- We received a Thank You card complimenting the ambulance service.

**City Administrator's Comments:**

- Sanitation District changed their format so the sewer easements had to be redone. The project is about 50% complete and are currently working on putting in the pumps and restoration.
- Still in the process of obtaining the dredging permit and they are now requiring that silt testing be done. Thelen's cost for testing is \$2604.50 and Tencon cost is approximately \$2300.00.

Discussion ensued regarding the permit and soil testing process.

**Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Herald to approve the funds for silt testing with Tencon in the amount of approximately \$2,300.00. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.**

- Planning & Zoning approved the Phase II Development Plan for Holiday Inn Express. Due to the Mixed Land Use Zone (MLU) it requires city council to approve the development plan also.

**Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Honaker to accept Planning & Zoning's Recommendation to approve the Stage II Development Plan for Holiday Inn Express with the following conditions: Storm Water to be approved by City Engineer, Pedestrian ways to be approved between lot 5 and 6 and other lots to provide a network of access among the users of the subdivision and SD1 Land Disturbance Permit must be issued. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.**

- Gave a copy of the SWEMS Budget to council.

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**Council Comments:**

**Councilwoman Gearding:**

- No comment.

**Councilman Honaker:**

- Stated he was impressed with Police, Fire and Maintenance at Kids Fest.

**Councilman Blankenship**

- Asked if they would like to do a city tour again.

Discussion ensued regarding the date of the tour and Councilman Herald has access to a van that they can use for the tour.

**Councilman Gilkison:**

- Stated that he had an untimely incident with the fire emergency and thanked the fire department for their quick response.

**Councilwoman Jones:**

- Thanked Mr. Vance for taking the time to answer all of her questions regarding the budget.

**Councilman Herald:**

- Echoed Mayor Turner's comments regarding the Summer Recreation Program encouraged anyone with children in the city to send them.

Discussion ensued regarding the details of the program.

**City Clerk:**

- No comment.

**Police Chief Comments:**

- Kids Fest was a success and the attendance numbers were up this year. He thanked everyone for their help and those who attended.
- Thanked the Wilder Firefighters Union for their donation of \$500 for Kids Fest for next year.

**Fire Chief Comments:**

- Captain Neyman announced that he had the new pumper for everyone to see.
- Advised that the fire department is still in the running for a Fema Grant for \$157,000.
- He feels that the Medics we have are great at making quick decisions which can make things a minor incident.


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
**Adjournment:**
